ACADEMIC/MERIT

Our academic merit scholarship program offers awards based on academic performance prior to enrolling. Those applying as a full-time, degree-seeking student will automatically be considered for scholarship, whether entering from high school or transferring from another college. Scholarship notification occurs upon admission to the University of Dayton.

Entering first-year student scholarships are renewable for four years; transfer student scholarship for three, provided the student maintains a 3.0 GPA, is registered full-time and is a responsible member of the University community.

ATHLETIC

An NCAA Division I member in all varsity sports except football (D-IAA), intercollegiate athletic scholarships are awarded each year to entering students. Contact the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics at 937-229-2100 for more information.

DEACONS SCHOLARSHIP

A student whose father, grandfather or uncle is a permanent, active deacon of the Roman Catholic or Orthodox Church can apply for the Deacons Scholarship. The award is \$4,000 per year and may be renewed for up to four years. Funds are limited; therefore, only one student per family can receive the scholarship.

The initial award must be made for the first year – upperclass students cannot apply. The admission application serves as this scholarship's application. If submitting the Common Application, contact us at finaid@udayton.edu with the name and University of Dayton ID of the student, along with the name of the Deacon, his diocese and relationship to the student.

DEPARTMENT/DIVISION AWARDS

Students may find that they are eligible to receive additional scholarship funds from their academic department/division. Typically, departments who have such funds available notify students directly about these opportunities.

ENDOWED AWARDS

Corporations, foundations, service groups and individual benefactors sponsor scholarships for upperclass students through the Endowed Scholarship program. Awards are given based on financial need, academic achievement, leadership and/or service to the school and community while enrolled at the University of Dayton.

Amounts vary by award and awards can be one-year only or renewable. Students are selected and notified throughout the award year, and in most cases, no application is needed.

MUSIC

Music scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis following an audition with the music faculty, typically in January/February. Award amounts vary. Contact the Department of Music at 937-229-3936 for more information.

NATIONAL ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

The University's National Alumni Association sponsors a \$5,000 renewable scholarship for a student whose parent or grandparent is a UD graduate. Selection criteria include financial need, academic performance, standardized test scores and service.

The initial award must be made for the first year – upperclass students cannot apply – and the admission application serves as this scholarship's application. If you use the Common Application and wish to be considered for this award, please contact us at finaid@udayton.edu.

NATIONAL MERIT

National Merit Scholarships are awarded to National Merit Finalists who designate the University of Dayton as their first-choice school. Amounts are either \$1,000 or \$2,000 per year.

U.S. AIR FORCE ROTC

U.S. Air Force R.O.T.C. scholarships are offered nationally and may be used at the University of Dayton. Aerospace studies courses are taken at Wright State University in Dayton and all other courses (including PT) are taken at UD. Contact the WSU AFROTC Detachment 643 at 937-775-2730.

Beginning with the 2011 entering class, the University will provide AFROTC award recipients with a \$5,000 per year ROTC Incentive Grant, in addition to any UD merit scholarship awarded. The total of all aid (including the ROTC award) cannot exceed the cost of attendance.

U.S. ARMY R.O.T.C.

U.S. Army R.O.T.C. scholarships are offered nationally and may be used at the University of Dayton. The Department of Military Science oversees the Fighting Flyer Battalion and all courses are taken on campus.

Currently, the University provides those AROTC cadets receiving four-year scholarships with a room and board incentive. The total of all aid (including the ROTC award) cannot exceed the cost of attendance.

VISUAL ARTS

Visual arts scholarships are awarded annually on a competitive basis. Entering students must submit a portfolio to be reviewed by the visual arts faculty. Four-year awards are renewed based upon the recommendation of the visual arts chairperson. Students may contact the Department of Visual Arts at 937-229-3237 for more information.
