- Students must meet with the advisor before acceptance into this program.
- EDT 110 and Lab course, The Profession of Teaching, is required by the University of Dayton to be successfully completed by all students in the Department of Teacher Education. For current Sinclair students accepted into the UD-Sinclair Academy, this course may be taken at the University of Dayton, at no cost to the student, while still taking classes at Sinclair. The University of Dayton advisors can provide information regarding eligibility and registration. We strongly encourage Academy students to take EDT 110 and Lab at the University of Dayton prior to transitioning to the University of Dayton. Please note that EDT 110 and lab also be used for Sinclair's EDU 1100 when required for the associate degree.
- ECE 1101 and EDU 1100 with PSY 2242 meet requirements for EDT 207.
- ECE 2300 and EDU 1105 meet the requirement for EDT 340.
- COM 2211 will meet the communication requirement at the University of Dayton with the completion of the Associate Degree. This applies to UD-Sinclair Academy students only.
- PSY 1100 will meet the social science integrated course requirement at the University of Dayton with the completion of the Associate Degree.
- PHL 1XC at UD will substitute for PHL 103 requirement. This exception applies to only UD-Sinclair Academy students. Consult with your UD advisor if you are eligible for this exception.
- REL 1XC at UD will substitute for REL 103 requirement. This exception applies to only UD-Sinclair Academy students. Consult with your UD advisor if you are eligible for this exception.
- Beginning Fall 2019, MAT 1510 and MAT 1520 will replace MAT 1410, MAT 1420, and MAT 1430. Please see your Sinclair advisor for more information.
- 124 hours minimum are required for the BSE.
- 54 semester hours must be taken from a four year college or university and the last 30 semester hours must be taken at the University of Dayton.
- Required GPA at the time of the Associates Degree is 3.0.
- Hours may change based on Licensure Program requirements.
- Students are strongly recommended to begin their University of Dayton programs fall term.
- It is recommended that students take at least 15 hours per semester at Sinclair.
