Description: Graduate Assistantship in the School of Engineering ETHOS Center.

Minimum Qualifications:

- BS in any engineering field.
- Experience traveling and working overseas with the ETHOS program or another similar program.
- Admission to a University of Dayton graduate program.

- Demonstrated leadership qualities.
- Interested in pursuing ETHOS related research.
- Community-engaged learning experience.
- Tutoring or teaching experience.
- Spanish or French competency.

Responsibilities: Included but not limited to:

- Recruitment of students for ETHOS international programs, local and domestic immersion programs and short break out programs which includes hosting information sessions, meeting with departments, interviewing students, and marketing.
- Review of applications, coordinating interviews with students and assisting in the final selection process for immersion programs and short break out programs.
- Administration of the Studio Abroad application process.
- Assist with site placements.
- Communicate with site coordinators.
- Coordinate and implement classes for immersions participants and break out participants.
- Review and grade student homework and technical reports.
- Visit domestic and international partner sites and complete site evaluations.
- Coordination of fall retreat, community dinners, and other ETHOS Center events.

Stipend: \$14,000

Tuition Remission: Maximum of 15 credit hours per year.

Work Hours: Flexible hours between 8:30 and 4:30. Also involves some weekend and evening hours for special events. During spring semester includes EGR 330/430/530 class times in the evenings. Expectations 20 hours/week.
