Nancy Mairs (MFA, PhD, University of Arizona), is an American poet, memoir writer, and essayist who has received the Western States Book Award, fellowships from the National Endowment of the Arts and the Soros Foundation's Project on Death in America. Her work explores faith, feminism, dis/ability, and death.

Her published work includes: *In All the Rooms of the Yellow House*; *Plaintext - Deciphering a Woman's Life*; *Carnal Acts*; *Voice Lessons - On Becoming a (Woman) Writer*; *Waist-High in the World - A Life Among the Nondisabled*; and a spiritual autobiography: *Ordinary Time - Cycles in Marriage, Faith, and Renewal*. Her most recent book is *A Dynamic God - Living an Unconventional Catholic Faith*.
