## How about financial aid?

Army ROTC offers you several opportunities for scholarships at the University of Dayton. While in high school, you may compete for four-year scholarships which pay tuition up to \$17,000 per year. The university adds to the value of these scholarships by offering awards such as the remainder of tuition, free housing, and meal plans not covered by the ROTC scholarship.

Once on campus, you may apply for four-year, three-year, and two-year scholarships; these also pay tuition up to \$17,000 per year. All scholarships also include \$600 per year for books and \$250-\$400 per school month for living expenses.

## How do I get into the program?

Getting into Army ROTC is as easy as registering for a first-year UD course. There are options for students who enter after their first year to attend four weeks of summer training (with pay) in place of basic courses on campus.

Veterans and students serving in the Reserve or National Guard may qualify to enter directly into advanced courses.

## About the University.

The University of Dayton is a private, co-educational school founded and directed by the Marianist Society. It is located on a 100 acre campus in the city of Dayton, Ohio. Over 6100 undergraduate students are enrolled at UD in schools of Business Administration, Education, Engineering, and Law and the College of Arts & Sciences.



## What is the Army ROTC?

Army ROTC is a program of leadership and military skills training. It prepares University of Dayton students for officer responsibilities in the active Army, Army Reserve, or Army National Guard following graduation.

## How Do Army ROTC courses fit in?

Army ROTC involves one course and lab on campus each semester. The courses fit into most academic programs as *electives*. First and second-year courses are *tuition-free* to UD students.

Weekly labs involve military skills training and adventure activities such as rappelling and rifle marksmanship.

## What else does the program offer?

Army ROTC cadets put their leadership studies into action during two field training exercises each year. These weekend activities are required for students in advanced courses; many other students choose to participate as well.

Near the end of the program, cadets attend a paid summer leadership camp where they receive advanced military skills training and an evaluation of their leadership skills. Students also have opportunities for summer internships at Army posts and special military training such as Airborne and Air Assault.

UD Army ROTC extracurricular activities include the rigorous training of the *Ranger Company*, tradition and honor of *Pershing Rifles Drill & Ceremony Unit*, professional organization of *AUSA*, and competition of campus *intramural sports*. Cadet social activities include an annual *Military Ball and Dining-In*.
