UD/MIAMI VALLEY HOSPITAL HEALTHCARE SYMPOSIUM SET FOR APRIL 5

The focus of the Fifth Annual University of Dayton/Miami Valley Hospital Healthcare Symposium is "Innovations in Healthcare Delivery" and will highlight several organizations and individuals who are making great strides in changing the ways healthcare is delivered so as to improve outcomes and lower costs. Dr. Marjorie Bowman, Dean of Wright State University Boonshoft School of Medicine will return as our moderator. The symposium will feature TR Reid, foreign correspondent who will discuss "US Healthcare: The Good News." Additional confirmed speakers to present include David Moen, MD, and Ken Coburn, MD, MPH. David Moen, M.D., is president of Bluestone Solutions LLC, which focuses on eliminating unnecessary hospitalizations and readmissions by bringing key services into the homes of high-risk patients before acute situations arise. Ken Coburn, M.D., M.P.H., is co-founder, CEO and medical director of Health Quality Partners, which has designed a health care model that has reduced deaths, reduced hospitalizations and lowered cost for high-risk, chronically ill Medicare beneficiaries.

The general morning session will be followed by a luncheon and reception for physicians and students. This will be followed by an afternoon Student Symposium which will feature panel presentations focusing on helping students prepare for training and careers in health professions.

Application Workshops

The Premedical Programs Office will conduct two workshops that will detail the process for prospective health professional school candidates. If your goal is to obtain a composite letter during the year 2014, you must attend ONE of these workshops. The content of each will be the same; students should attend the workshop that best fits their schedule. Students interested in any health care professional school can benefit from this workshop. We will describe how centralized services work and detail the services provided by the PPO.

The workshops will be held on January 28th and 29th at 5 pm in the Science Center Auditorium (SC 114).
NOTE: Pictures are required for all students using the services of the PPO. We will be at both meetings with a camera to take your picture. Be prepared.

Scholarships

This term we will accept applications for a series of scholarships offered through the Premedical Programs Office. Electronic application forms will be available through the PPO website at premed.udayton.edu beginning January 31, 2014. To be eligible, the student must currently be in their second or third year (minimum of 45 credits hours achieved), have a premedical advisor and have a current registration with the PPO. The application deadline is March 14, 2014. Each scholarship is applied to the student's financial aid during the NEXT academic year.

Everhard Scholarship: This private scholarship was created by Eleanor S. Everhard in memory of her parents, Aaron and Ann Everhard. The original fund was established in 1933. The Everhard Scholarship is limited to one academic year only, and is not renewable. *The Everhard Trust stipulates preference must be given to female applicants.*

Szabo Scholarship: This scholarship was established through a gift from the estates of Dr. Stephen E. and June H. Szabo in 1999. Dr. Szabo graduated from UD in 1935 majoring in Pre-Dentistry. During his practice, which spanned over 50 years, he fought for all oral surgeons in and around the Dayton area to have privileges to operate in all hospitals.

Michaelis Scholarship: This scholarship was established through a gift from the estate of Dr. Carl I. Michaelis in 2001. Dr. Michaelis was a Professor of Chemistry, whose teaching career began in 1954 at UD and spanned 36 years. In 1962, Michaelis instigated a switch from the local fraternity, Sigma Delta Pi, to the nationally recognized honor society, Alpha Epsilon Delta, and served as an advisor of the group until 1990.

Summer Opportunities

University of Toledo College of Medicine Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowship:

Application deadline is March 7, 2014. Opportunities for research in the areas of cardiovascular medicine, gerontology, neurology, HIV, endocrinology, orthopedic surgery, and pediatrics may be available. Underrepresented minority students, students from disadvantaged backgrounds and women are strongly encouraged to apply. Each accepted student will receive \$3,500 for a 10-week period of full-time research beginning June 2 - August 8, 2014.

University of Pittsburgh Summer Premedical Academic Enrichment Program (SPAEP):

The University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine sponsors the Summer Premedical Academic Enrichment Program (SPAEP) Level I or II. This program, open to high school graduates and college students, is designed specifically to prepare and support students who wish to pursue careers in the field of medicine. Spend seven weeks in Level I, strengthening your academic skills and learning more about careers in medicine. Or, spend seven weeks immersed and engaged in the work of physician-scientists including laboratory research and MCAT preparation through Level II. Both programs will enhance your skills and knowledge in science, writing and public speaking. All transportation, housing and meal costs are arranged by the program. Edward M. Chester, MD Summer Scholars Program:

The Edward M. Chester, MD, Summer Scholars Program awards 15 collegiate undergraduate students the opportunity to spend ten weeks over the summer in clinical laboratory research settings at MetroHealth Medical Center in Cleveland. There are opportunities for observation of surgery, hospital rounds, and other experiences at MetroHealth. Applicants must have completed their second year in the sciences and be a resident of Ohio or attend a university in Ohio. A stipend of \$2500 is provided but students are responsible for their own housing. The application deadline is Feb. 14, 2014. University of Cincinnati Summer Surgery and Summer Neuroscience Experiences:

The Summer Surgery Experience (SSE) and the Summer Neuroscience Experience (SNE) are each 10-day intensive immersion programs for academically talented undergraduate students who are interested in pursuing a career in medicine. These fast paced programs each include lab practica, operating room observations, shadowing with faculty, case studies, and presentations from University of Cincinnati College of Medicine faculty. HCS POSTER SESSION

For the first time, we will be hosting a poster session as part of the UD/MVH Healthcare Symposium. This event will be open to residents, medical students, graduate students in a healthcare related field, and undergraduates. The focus of this poster session is healthcare and medicine. Appropriate topics for posters include: healthcare delivery; health and wellness; disease: etiology, progression, treatment, prevention; public health; and translational research. Students may use natural science bench work research findings to provide a poster that focuses on clinical medicine implications and applications. The posters will be judged by physicians and faculty with awards given to each category of entrant (undergraduate, medical or graduate student, resident). Abstracts for proposed posters may be submitted at go.udayton.edu/udmvhsymposium. The deadline for submissions is February 28, 2014. All submitted projects must have an advisor approval and each submitted abstract will be reviewed by the poster session committee prior to acceptance. All poster session participants must be registered attendees at the conference.
