SUMMER STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM

Berlin and northeastern Germany give students an exceptional location to study how a country and a city divided by the Cold War and ideological differences have emerged as a model for the German way of meeting the challenges of sustainable development. Students will visit sites featuring “green” technology used in buildings, transportation, energy production, and manufacturing. They will talk to scientists doing research on the complex issues of sustainable development and meet with business people and politicians from all sides of the political spectrum who see sustainable development as an acceptable norm for conducting business and doing politics. Throughout, students will experience the rich life of a European metropolis, while learning the history and philosophy of sustainability.
