








Bucket Buddies meet weekly with students.</li> <li>• Book Fair Helper: A Scholastic Book Fair takes place at DECA PREP twice per year. Help students select age-appropriate books and encourage passion for reading!</li> </ul> <p><b>DECA Middle</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Working Friday Nights: Students at DECA Middle attend a study hall after school on Friday evenings to complete assignments and prepare for the next week. This takes place from 3:30-6:00 p.m. Volunteers are needed to tutor students.</li> </ul> <p><b>DECA High</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Edit Night: Attend an Edit Night to help students revise and rewrite required essays. Usually takes place from 4:00-7:00 p.m. periodically throughout the school year.</li> <li>• Montgomery County College Promise Mentor: Be a mentor in a program which directly benefits DECA. Specific duties include: pricing and stocking donated items; maintaining cleanliness and organization of the YW Store; answering questions about items; documenting all sales in the sale log; opening and closing the store on time; processing item returns; maintaining the integrity of the YW Store by following YW Store Rules. <i>Needs background check.</i> <b>Hope's Closet Attendant:</b> Responsible for providing positive customer service to YWCA clients, residents, and staff who visit Hope's Closet. Specific duties include: maintaining the cleanliness and organization of Hope's Closet; greeting visitors and helping them locate items; documenting all visitors and items taken; opening and closing Hope's Closet on time. <i>Needs background check.</i> <b>Resource Center Attendant:</b> Responsible for providing positive customer service to YWCA clients and residents who utilize the Resource Center. Specific duties include: maintaining the cleanliness and organization of the Resource Center; familiarizing yourself with resources displayed and with community resources in the greater Dayton area; ensuring all participants sign in and out; opening and closing the Resource Center on time; assisting program participants with technological tasks, such as making photocopies and using the computer. <i>Needs background check.</i> <b>Donations Sorter:</b> Sort, inventory, and store incoming donations (instructions provided onsite).
