Fellowship Overview:

The HSI Undergraduate Sustainability Fellowship program allows University of Dayton undergraduate students to explore the field of sustainability while contributing to dynamic projects/programs on our campus and in our local community.

The program will consist of two cohorts. One cohort will work on University of Dayton campus projects and the other in the Greater Dayton community through host organizations. Fellows will be co-mentored by both HSI Faculty/Staff and their host department/ site.

Fellowship Award:

- \$7500 if campus housing is needed
- \$6000 if no housing is needed

Duration: May 13th - August 2nd, 2024

Requirements:

- Attend program orientation in April: Date TBD
- Attend Midwest Sustainability Summit: May 2nd
- Attend weekly meetings as a cohort on Fridays from 9 am 12 pm
- Present final work at Fellows Showcase lunch in August: Date TBD

Eligibility: University of Dayton undergraduate students from any academic discipline are eligible to apply.

JOB FUNCTIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

This pivotal role is geared towards spearheading sustainable waste management initiatives within our campus community. The selected fellow will be responsible for researching waste reduction strategies and best practices tailored to our campus environment.

A primary focus will be crafting and implementing a pilot waste management system in a designated campus location, aiming to significantly reduce waste output while ensuring efficient and effective waste handling. This fellow will work closely with the Food Systems Coordinator Fellow to drive zero-waste events and initiatives aimed at minimizing waste related to dining services including but not limited to food waste and single-use plastics campus-wide.

- Conduct research on best practices for campus waste management systems and waste reduction campaigns.
- Design and implement a pilot waste system in a specific location on campus (residence hall, dining establishment, etc).
- Work closely with the Food Systems Coordinator Fellow on projects such as zero waste events and the reduction of single-use plastic in dining locations
- Support any additional on-campus summer events that require sustainability project support and education (examples include: reunion weekend, volunteer days, etc.)

- Effectively collaborate with campus stakeholders for projects that increase food access to students such as programming at the campus garden and a summer CSA program for students living on campus.
- Work closely with the Zero Waste Specialist Fellow on projects such as zero waste events and the reduction of single-use plastic in dining locations.
