Summer 2018 Internship Opportunity

IACT in Action! The Collaboration Accelerator is a unique, 8-week professional internship opportunity that consists of cross-sector collaborative challenges that integrate applied creativity, innovative perspectives and community development. This summer, we are seeking 10 of the most engaged and creative students from different academic areas of study, bringing them together to find creative solutions to real-world challenges posed by community partners. 2018 challenges will focus on K-12 education innovation and generational prevention of addiction. The program is led by the Institute of Applied Creativity for Transformation (IACT) at ArtStreet, with support from the Office of the Provost.

WHAT'S IN IT FOR YOU:

- Equip yourself with the imaginative and creative skills necessary to excel in the global workforce.
- Take creative and innovative theory and put it into professional practice.
- Build confidence to rethink traditional models for project delivery solutions.
- Be part of an immersive experience with people and places in the Miami Valley region.

DATES:

June 4 - July 27, 2018

Interns will work 35 hours/week and will be paid \$15/hour. Campus housing will be provided.

WHO SHOULD APPLY:

We are seeking a total of 10 interns for the summer. Current UD undergraduate students of any major are encouraged to apply. Students graduating in May 2018 are NOT eligible for this program.
