



School of Business Administration Transfer Credit Policy

Transfer Credit for Courses Taken at Other Universities

AACSB Standard 11 requires "Programs resulting in the same degree credential are structured and designed to ensure equivalence" and that transfer credit policies "should ensure that the academic work accepted from other institutions is comparable to the academic work required for the school's own degree programs."

To receive transfer credit to fulfill degree requirements in the SBA, the following criteria apply (in addition to any further requirements specified by UD):

- For a UD student to receive transfer credit for courses that are *required* in the business core or within a given SBA major, the course in question must be successfully completed either at a university with AACSB, EQUIS, or AMBA accreditation, or at a university with an international reputation as a leader in higher education, such as an Ivy League school. Further, the grade earned in this course must be assessed as equivalent to a C- or higher in the relevant UD course being replaced by this transfer credit.
- To receive transfer credit from another university for *elective* coursework required by a given SBA major, the student must obtain permission of the appropriate Department Chair prior to enrolling for such coursework. The Department Chair shall determine whether the course for which transfer credit is requested is comparable in rigor and content to similar coursework at UD. Further, the grade earned in this elective course must be assessed as equivalent to a C- or higher in comparable UD coursework.
