

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

You can register for UDLLI seminars by mail, email or telephone. In an attempt to provide equal registration opportunities for all participants, hand deliveries/walk-in registrations will no longer be accepted. **Due to the popularity of UDLLI seminars, please register promptly and whenever applicable, please indicate first, second and/or third choices.**

To register by mail

1. Complete the registration form on Page 51.
2. If you pay by check or money order, make it payable to “University of Dayton.” If you pay by credit card, complete the method of payment information and your signature.
3. Any registrations received before the opening of registration on Aug. 5 will have to be resubmitted.
