COUNSELING STUDENT FEEDBACK

Clinical Mental Health Counseling and School Counseling students provided feedback on the counseling programs. General themes from the feedback are summarized below:

THEMES FROM FEEDBACK

- Dublin students would like to be more connected to the University of Dayton community.
- Students felt that Research and Evaluation in the Human Services (EDC 568) should be a 12-week course.

IN RESPONSE TO FEEDBACK, THE FOLLOWING CHANGES WILL BE MADE:

- An Alumni Night will be held in Dublin at the beginning of the summer.
- Research and Evaluation in the Human Services (EDC 568) will be changed to a 12-week course (or Z course).

CACREP ACCREDITATION

The Board of Directors of the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Education Programs (CACREP) met January 11-13, 2018 for the purpose of making accreditation decisions. They reviewed two counseling programs housed in the School of Education and Health Sciences at the University of Dayton under the 2016 CACREP Standards. The Board made the following decisions:
