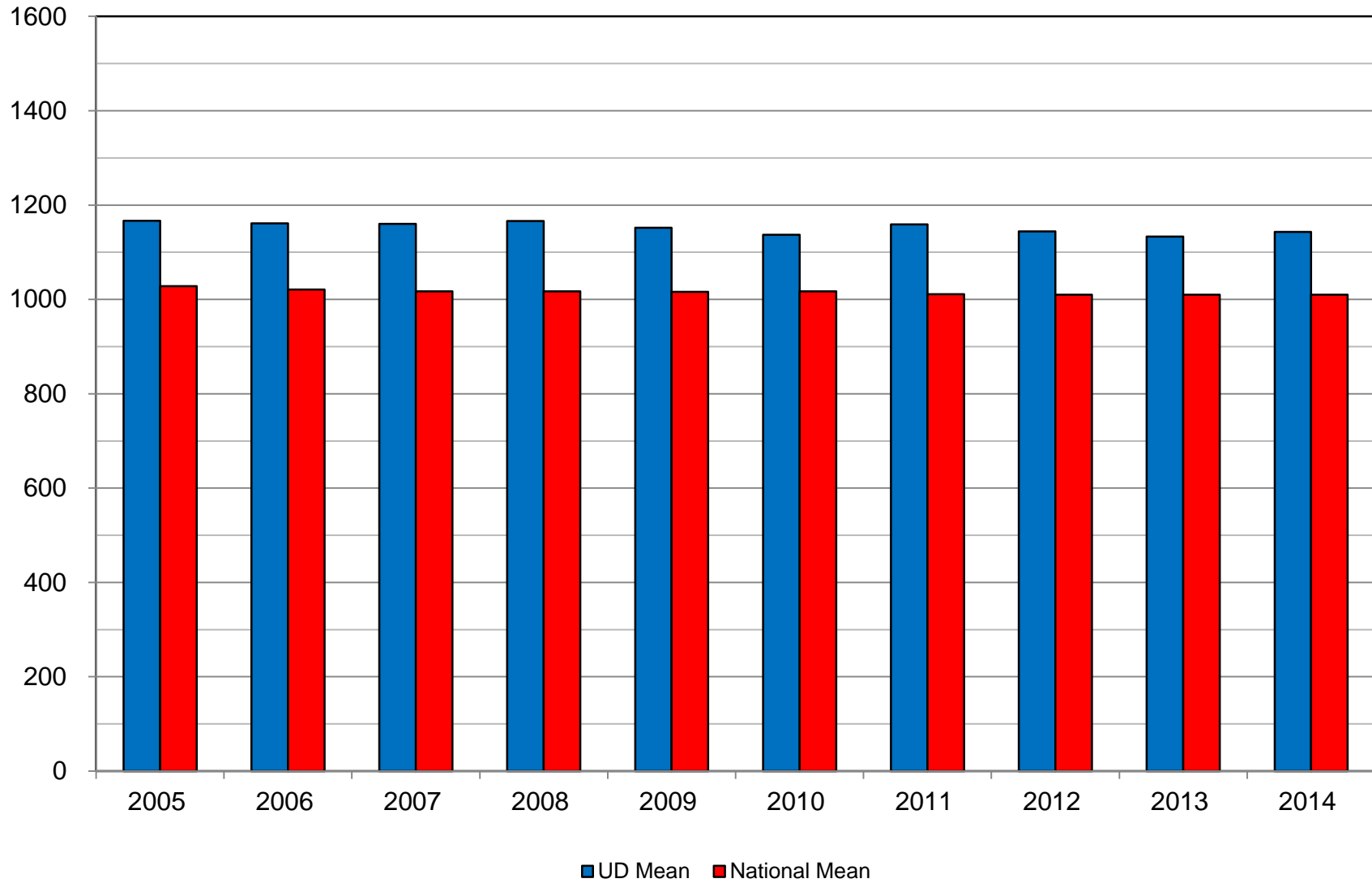

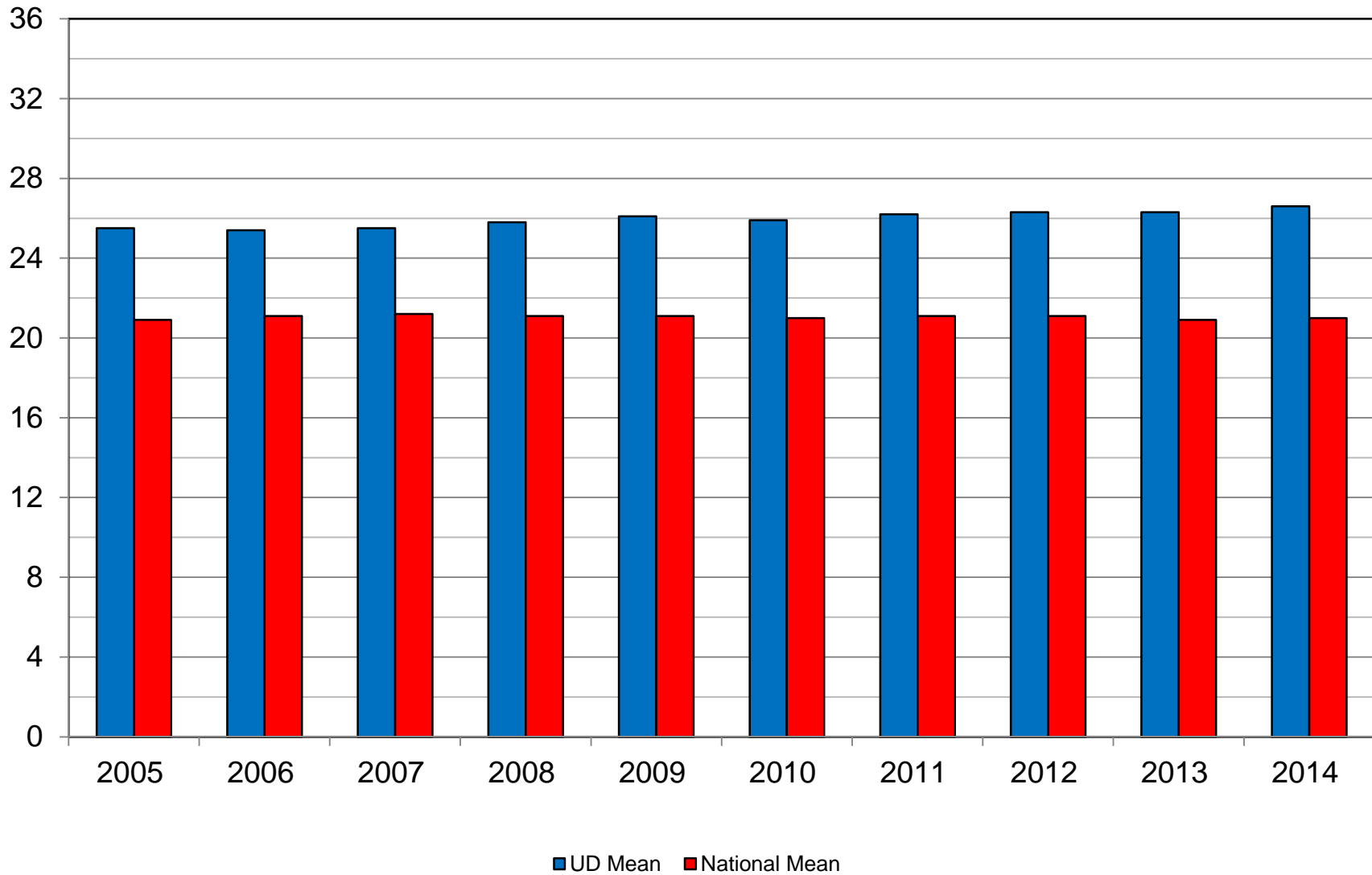

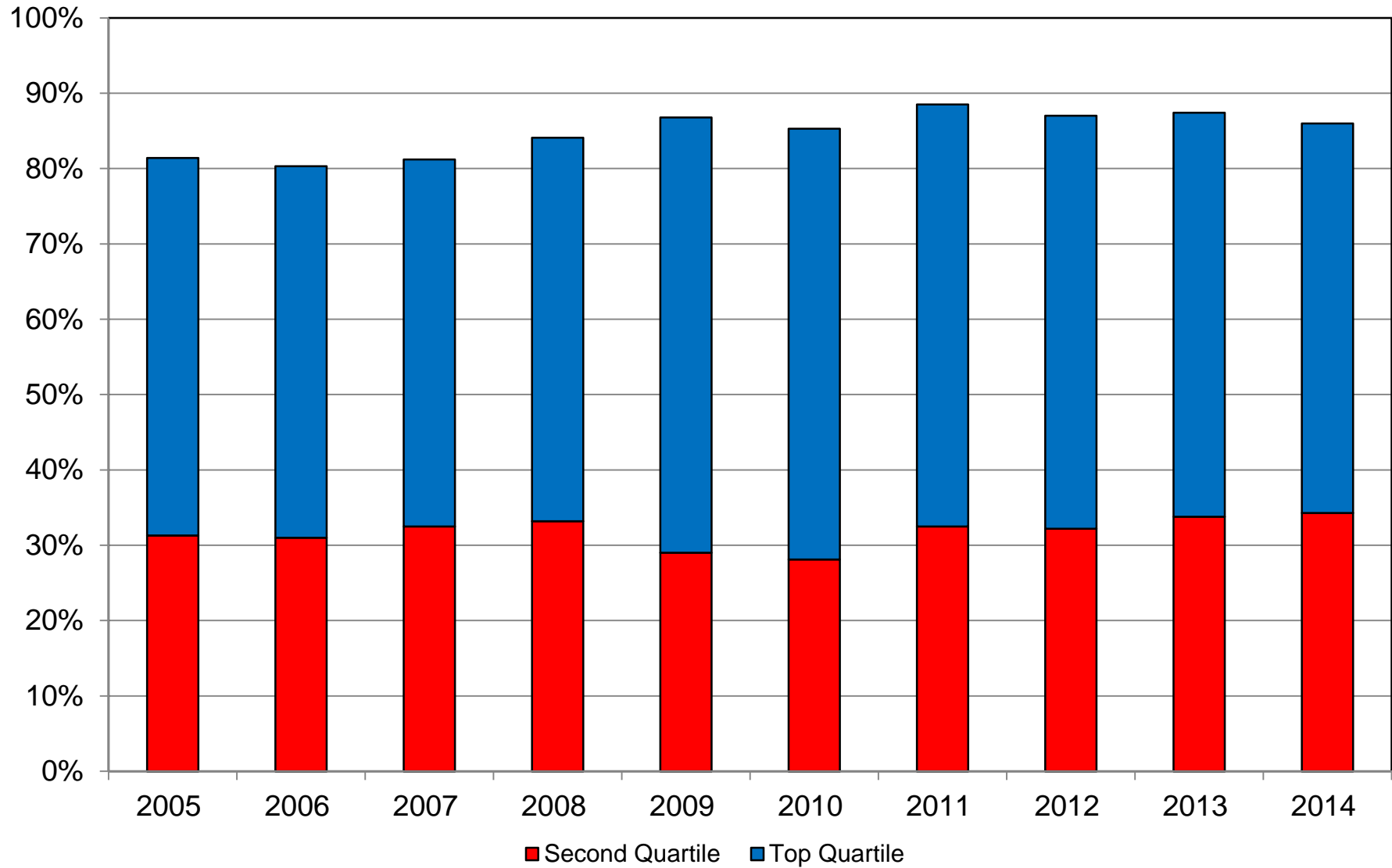
Admitted First Year Students Combined Verbal/Math SAT Scores

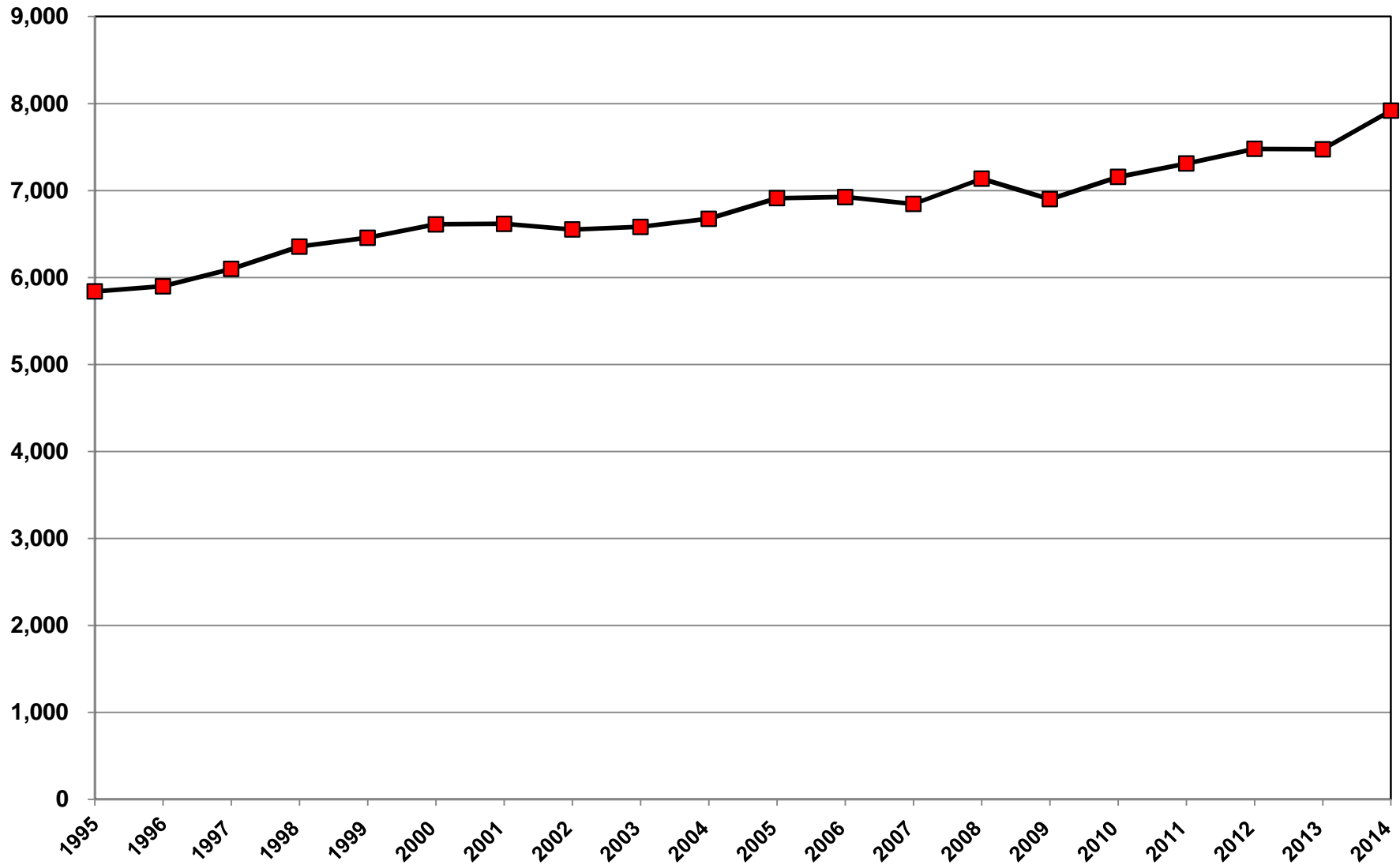

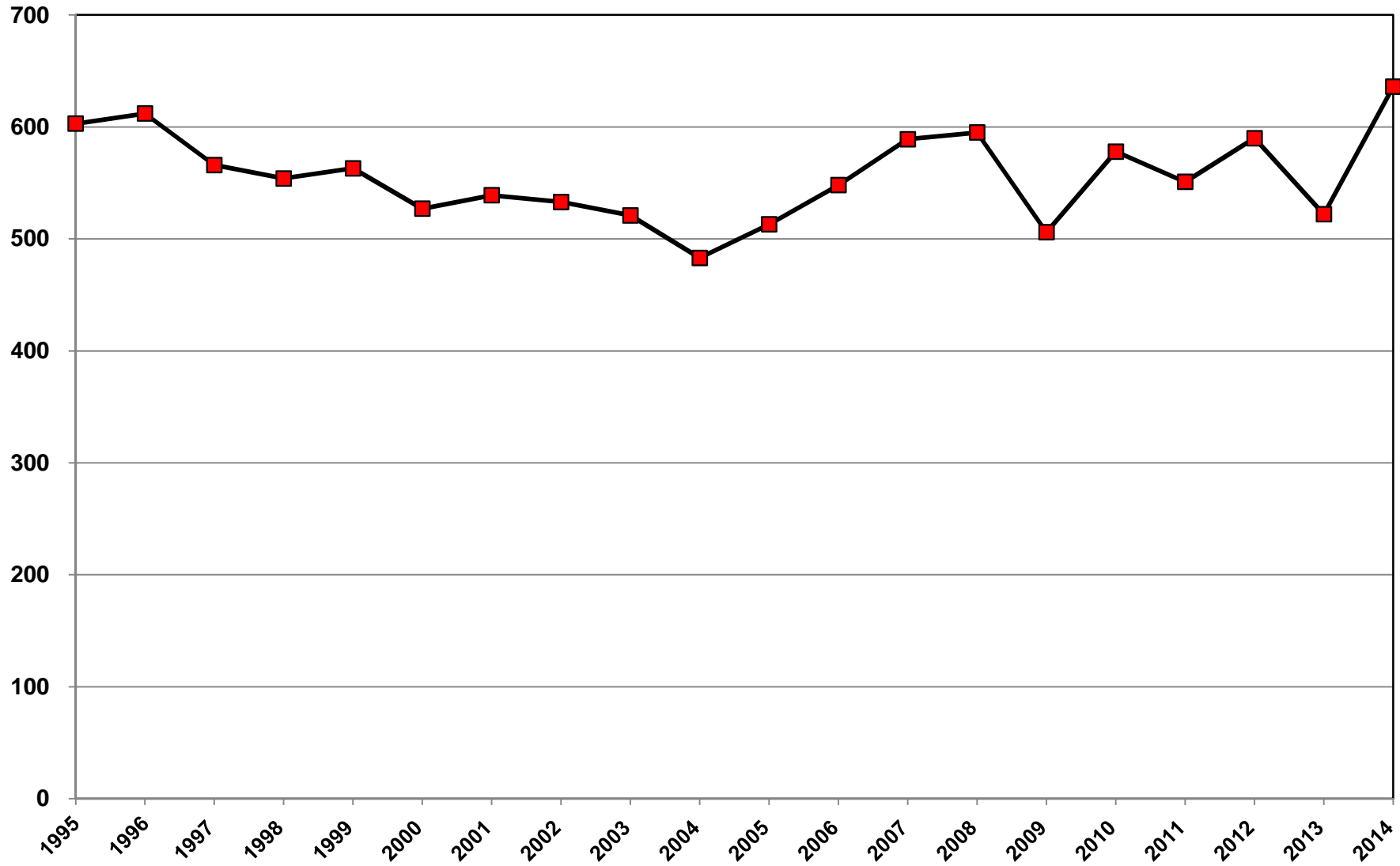

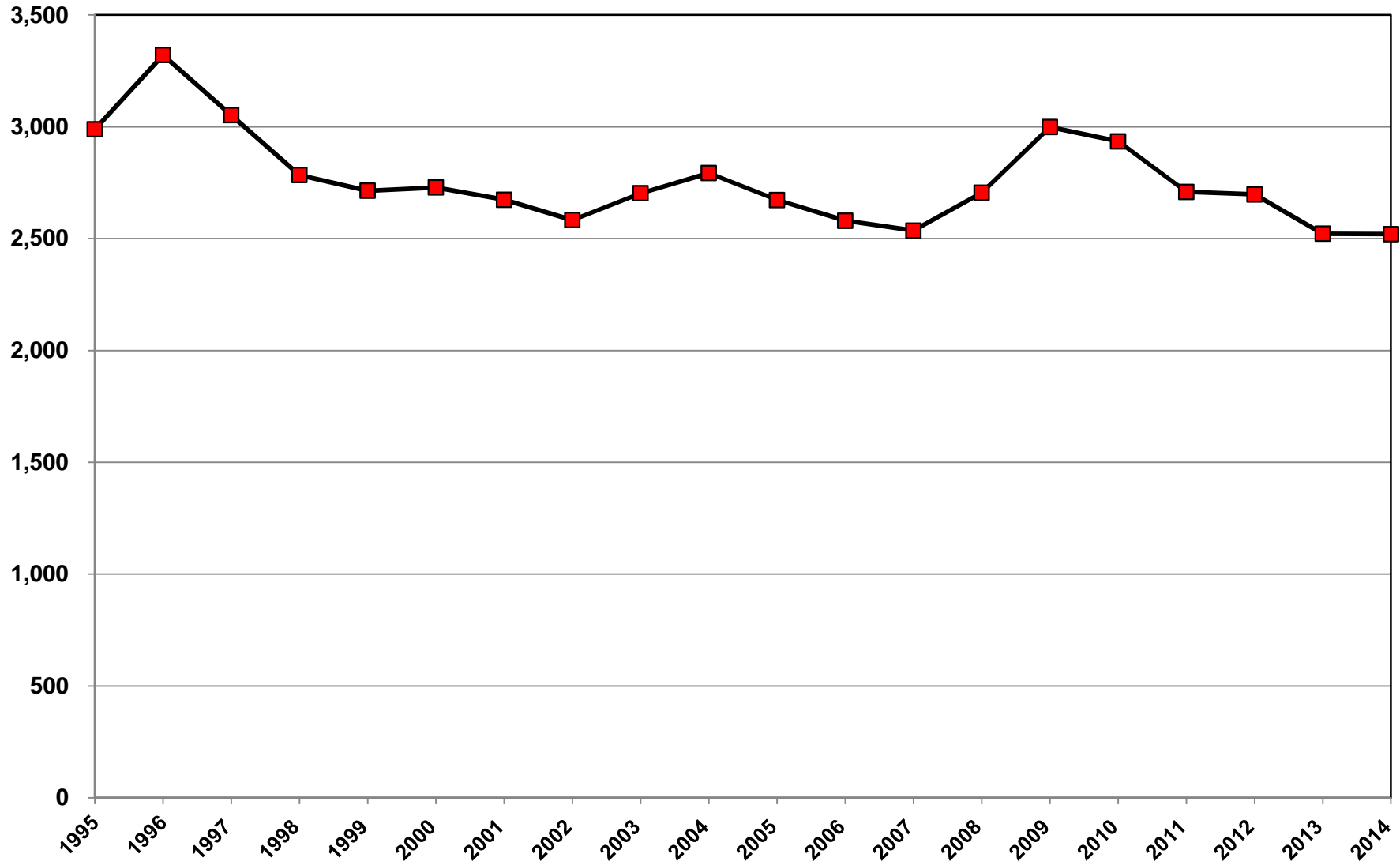
Fall Headcount Enrollment Full-Time Undergraduate Students



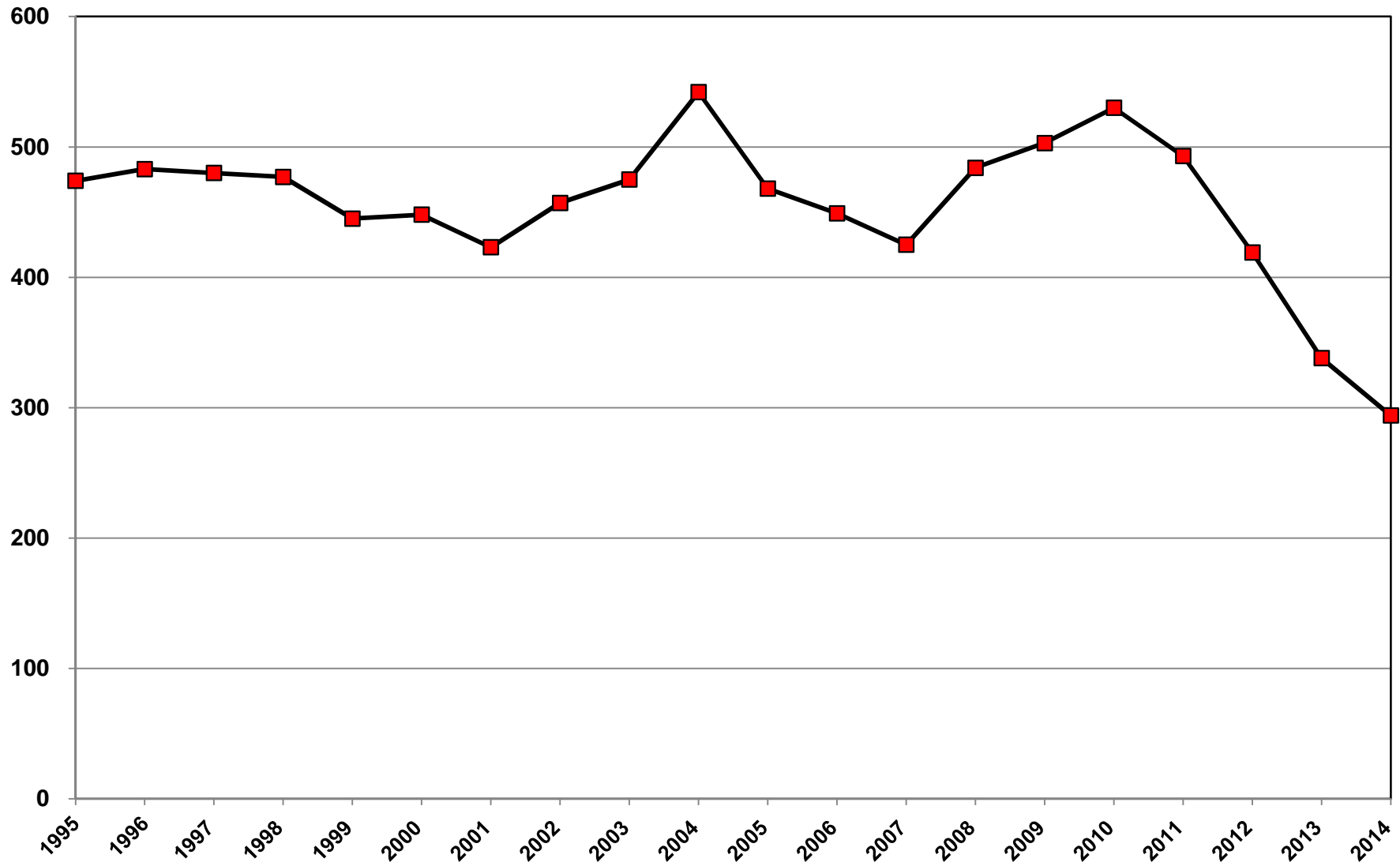
Fall Headcount Enrollment Part-Time Undergraduate Students

Fall Headcount Enrollment Law Students

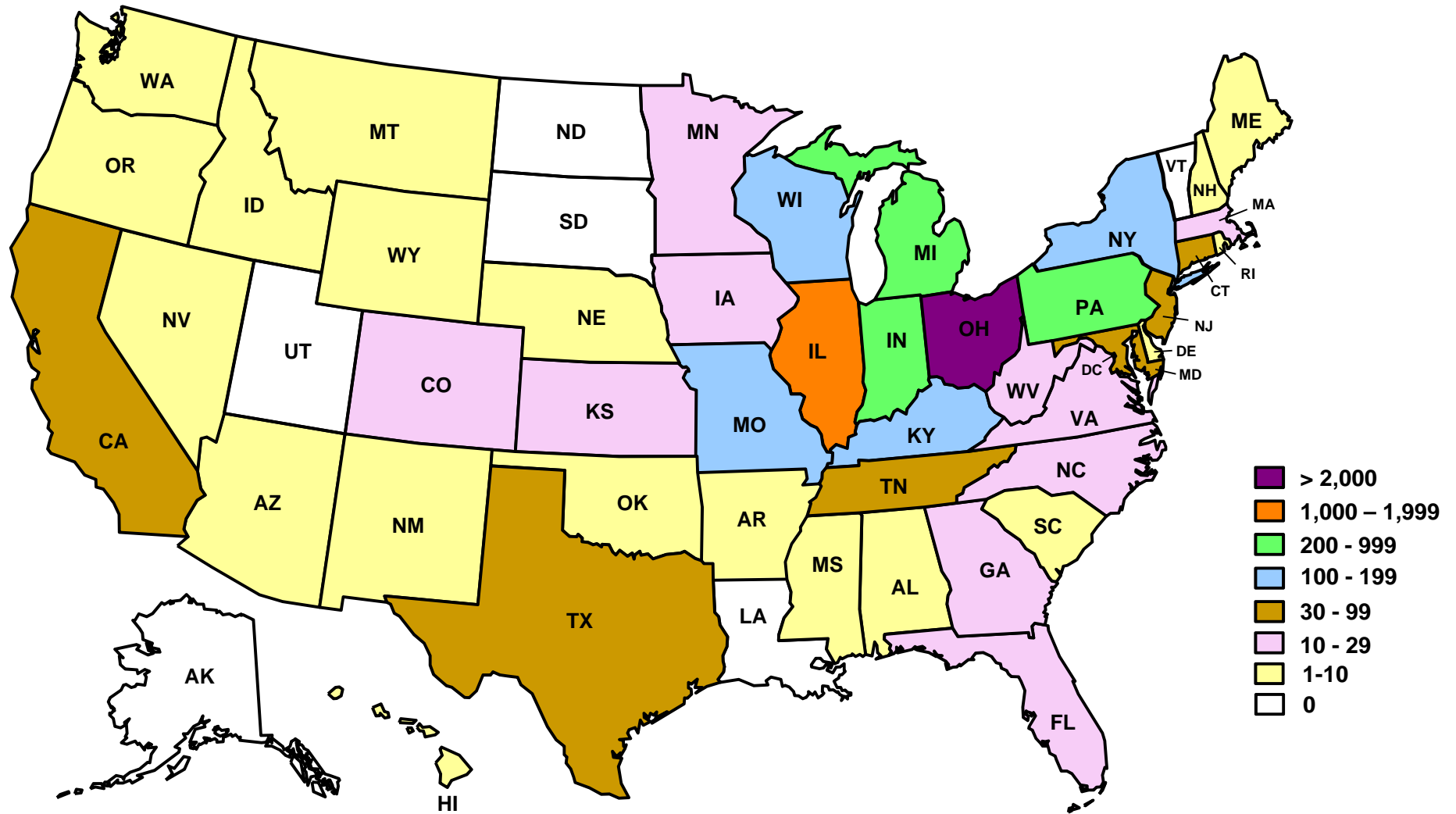

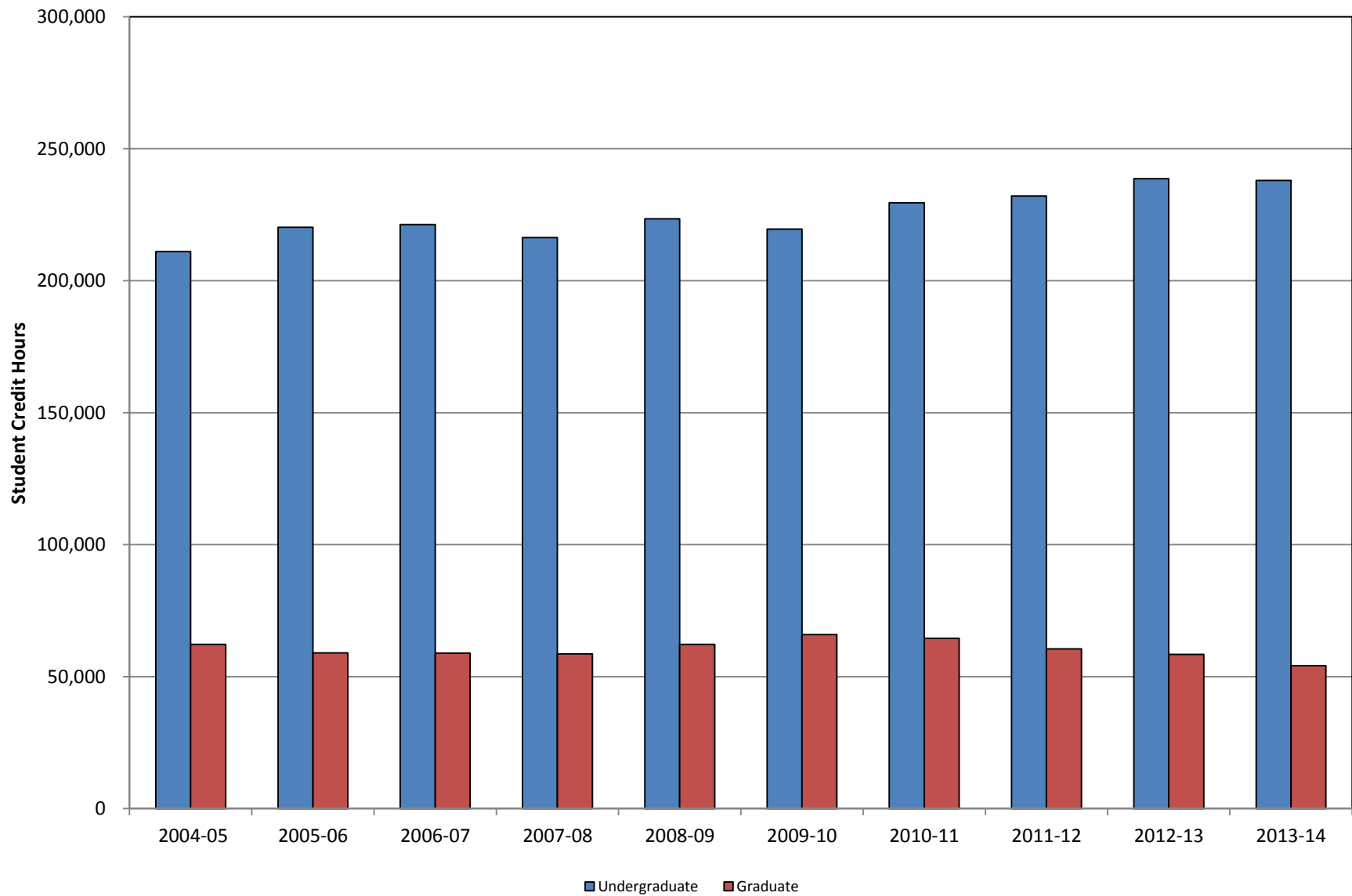

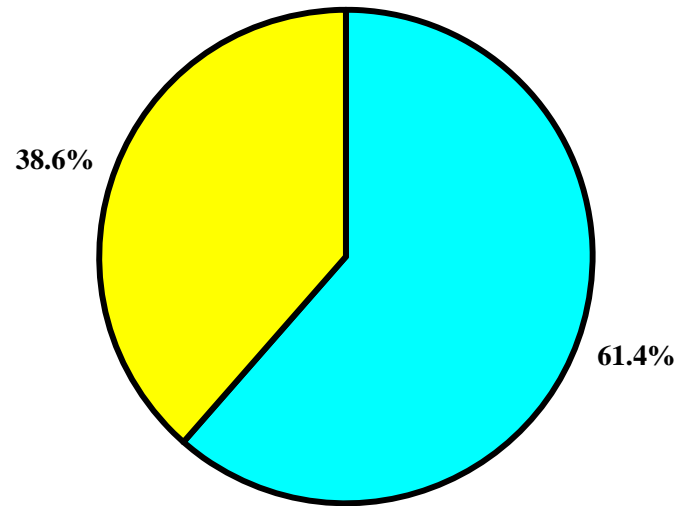

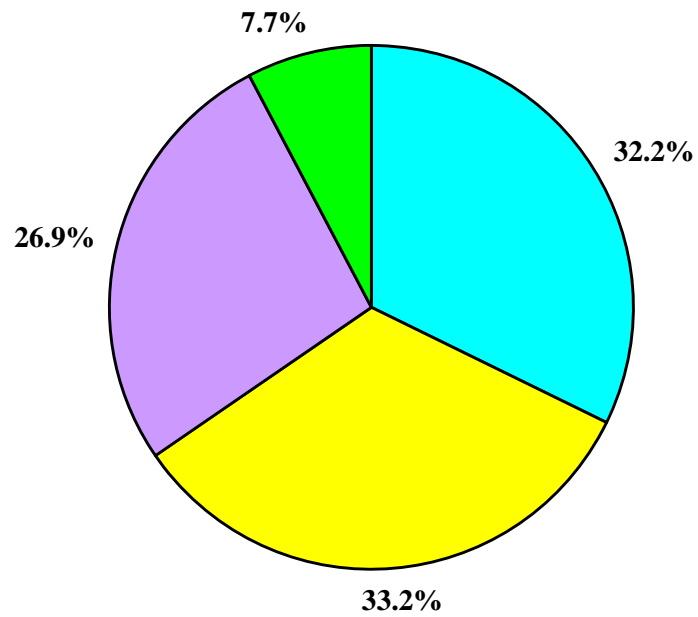

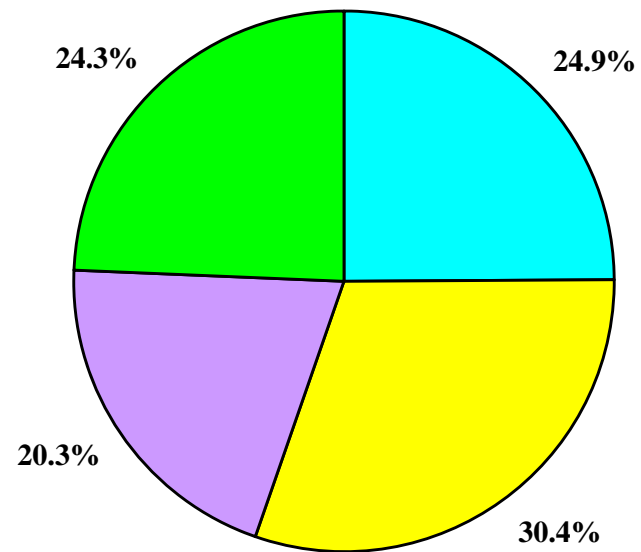

Full-Time Instructional Faculty by Rank



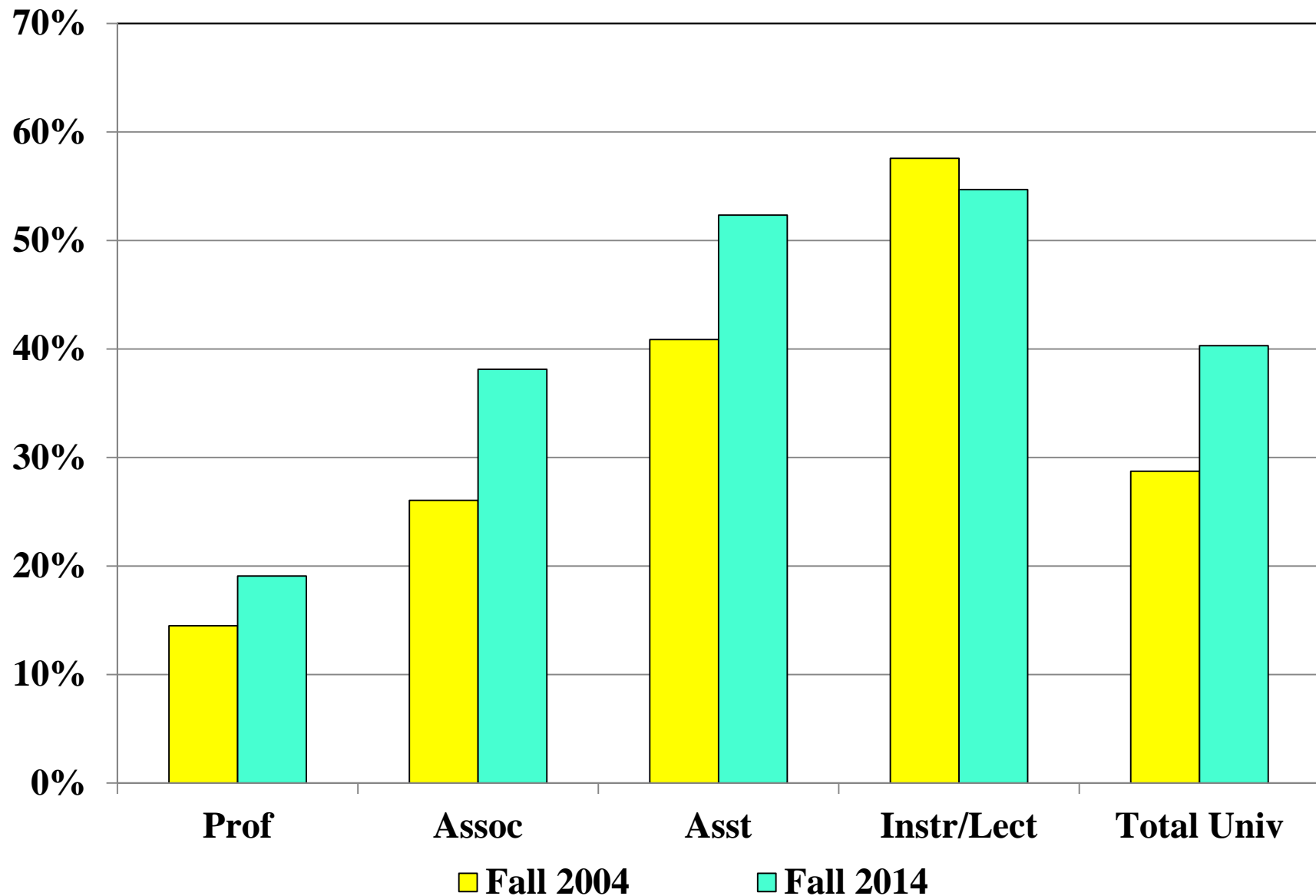

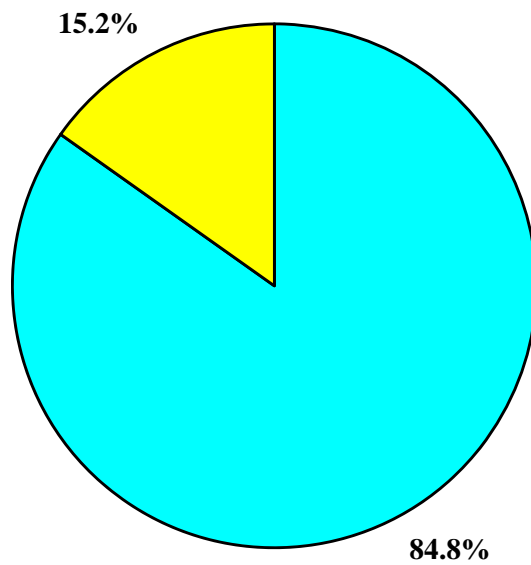

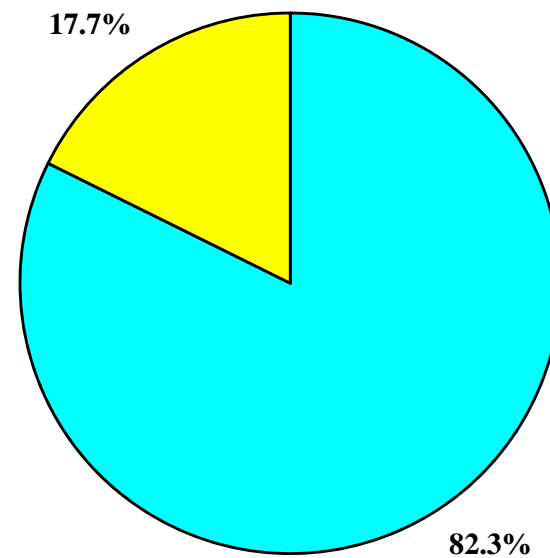
Percent of Full-Time Instructional Faculty Who Are Female by Rank

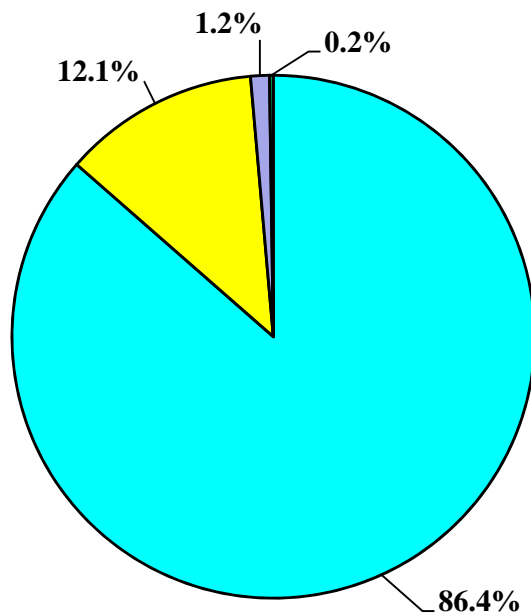

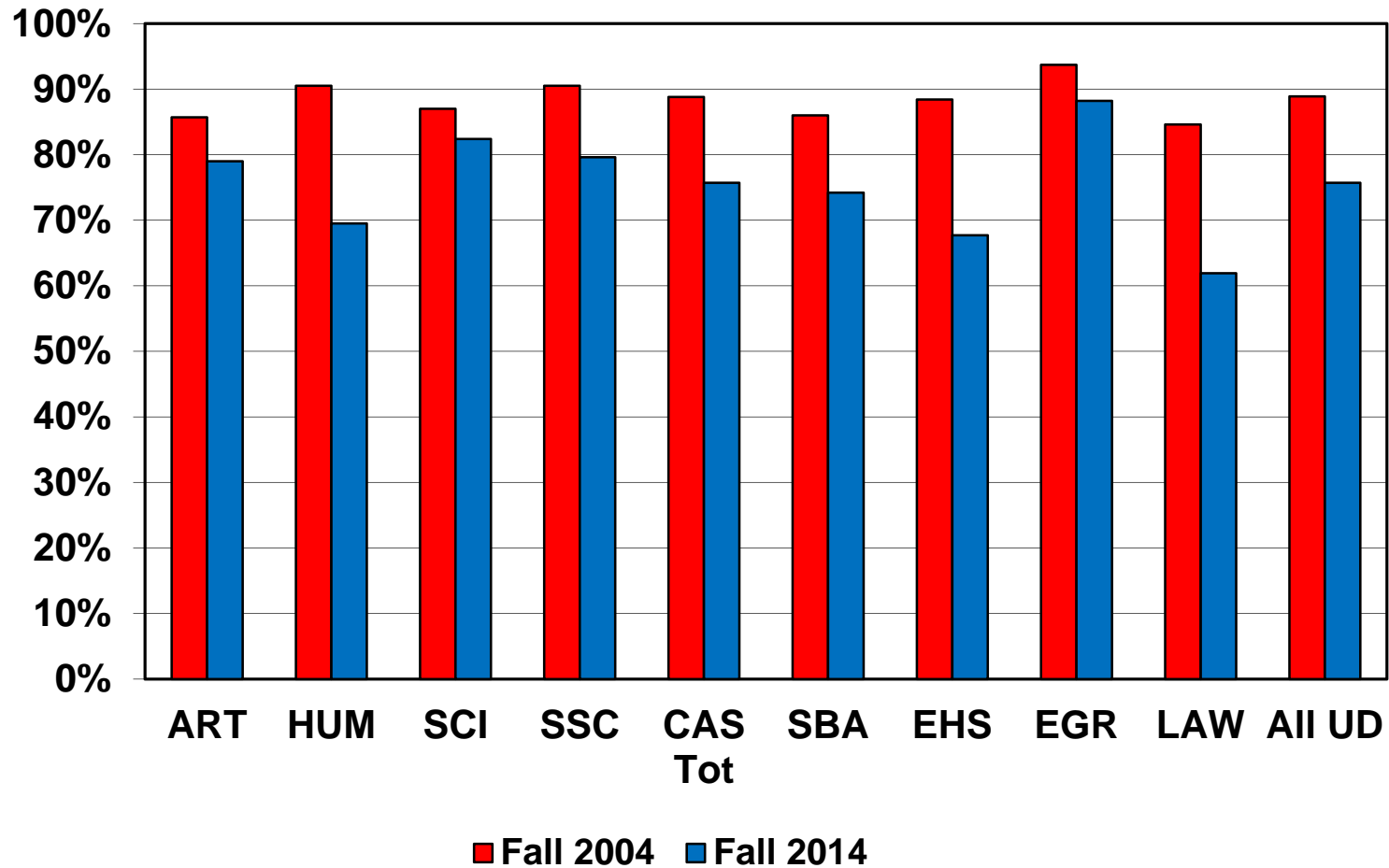

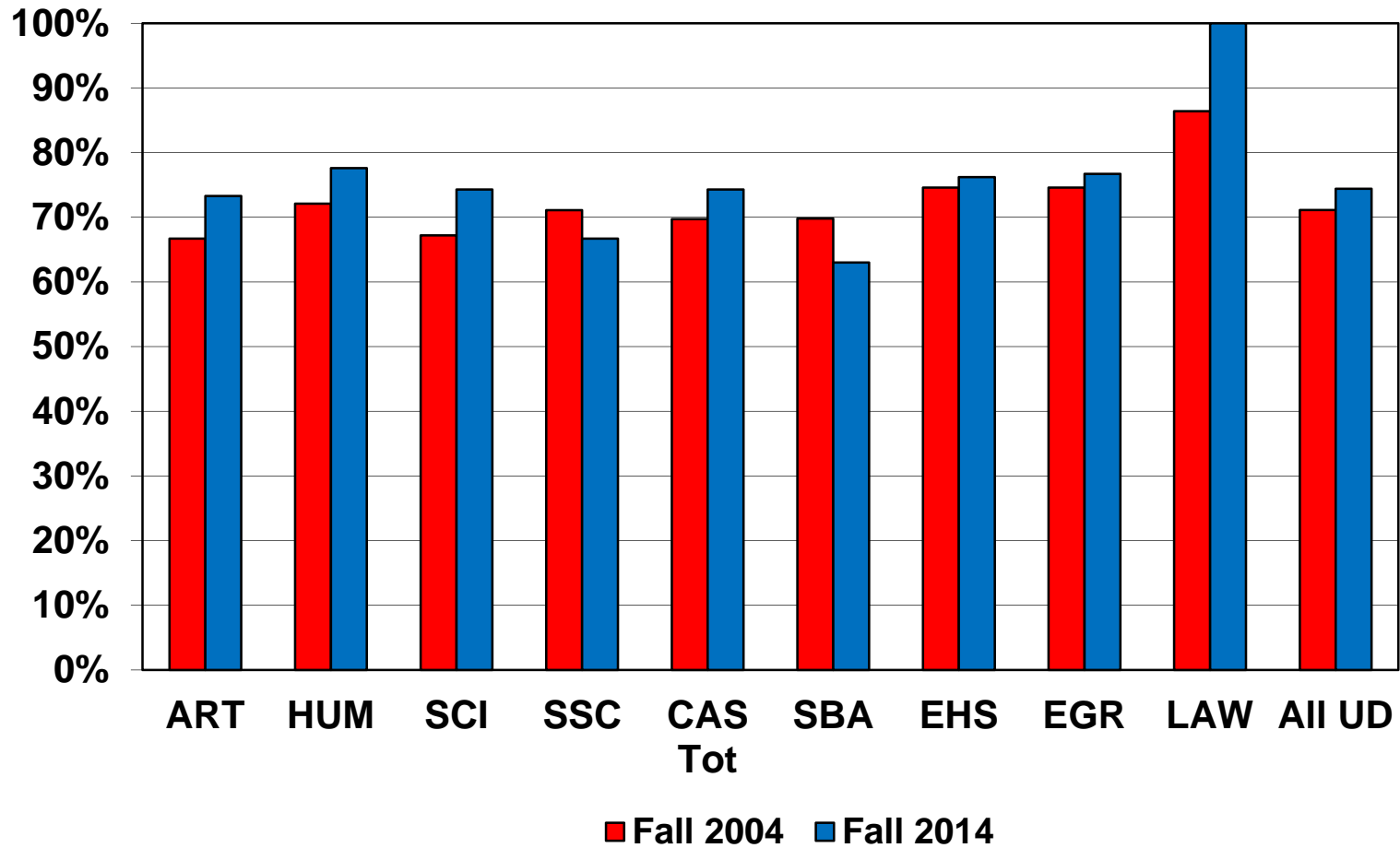

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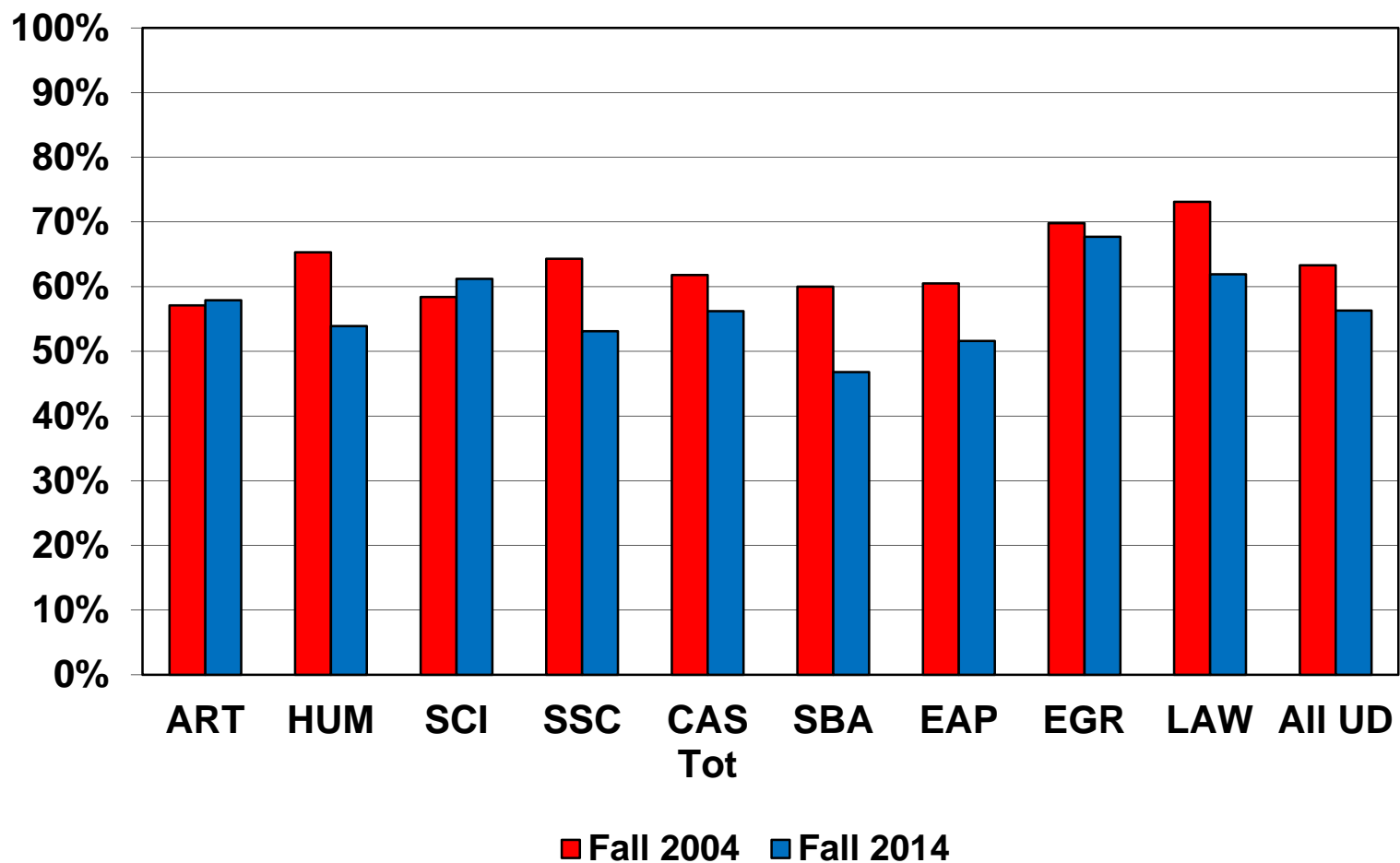
