Welcome!

At the University of Dayton, we educate in the “family spirit.” Since 2013, the Center for International Programs has coordinated an intercultural mentorship program, **International Friendship Families**. The goal is to make our University of Dayton community stronger by connecting current international students with UD faculty, staff, alumni, and local Dayton community members.

Why join? Research shows that friendships within the local community are key for international students who want to develop stronger language skills, greater academic achievement, lower levels of stress and become overall more comfortable with U.S. culture. However, it's often difficult to “break the ice” across cultures. As a member of Friendship Families, you'll help an international student feel “at home” in Dayton with a local family or individual. On top of this, you'll enjoy learning from your student about the culture and traditions of another part of the world.

How does it work? At our Kick-off Party, you will be matched with one or more international students for a semester-long partnership. After this first meeting, you and your student are simply expected to get together at least once a month for activities that you both enjoy - from sharing conversations around the dinner table and celebrating holidays, to participating in campus and community events. To get you started, we provide a menu of suggested activities (see below) as well as a few scheduled meetups to help keep everyone in touch.

At the end of each semester, we will invite all IFF participants to a Closing Celebration where we share photos and stories from our experiences, and recognize everyone's commitment through a short ceremony. After this, you and your student are free to continue meeting if you'd like, but this is completely up to you.

Thank you for being a part of this important mission! We appreciate that you are willing to begin this new adventure, bringing a global experience into your home, and extending a warm welcome to our international students at the University of Dayton.

PROGRAM BASICS

Please ✓ to confirm that you understand and agree:

- IFF is a **voluntary** program. It is organized by the University of Dayton's International Student & Scholar Services (ISSS) Office. The program's primary purpose is to promote cultural exchange between international students and local community members.
- IFF is **not** a host family program. Families are not expected to host students. This program is designed to provide the student and the family with flexibility and space in their relationship.
- IFF is not without risks. It is natural that in a cross-cultural interaction, some personality conflicts or cultural differences may happen. We expect you to communicate openly and respectfully with your student in order to resolve these conflicts. If needed, the program coordinator can help mediate conflicts. Families may also choose to withdraw from the program at any time.
- ISSS matches students with families based on each party's preferences. Depending on the number of participants each semester, we may not be able to meet all requests. We will do our best to support all students and Friendship Families to make meaningful connections.

PROGRAM EXPECTATIONS FOR FAMILIES

Please ✓ to confirm that you understand and agree:

You **are** expected to...

- Attend a Family Orientation Session** before matching with your student(s).
- Invite your student** to participate in activities that will help them learn more about American culture. We recommend you use the "Activities Menu" in this packet.
- Make every reasonable effort to **ensure the student's health and safety** when together.
- Share a few photos or stories** from your experience with the program coordinator. (You will receive occasional email newsletters for current IFF participants, where we'll share some of your photos & stories in order to inspire others with ideas for meetups!)

You **are not** expected to provide...

- Housing.** This is not a live-in host family program.
- Financial assistance.** Students are also advised not to request financial assistance.
- Academic support.** Students can find academic support on campus, whether through their academic advisor, the Office of Learning Resources, or the Center for International Programs.
- Transportation.** But you are welcome to if desired, since many international students do not have their own cars.
