Jelani Cobb is a faculty member at the Columbia University Graduate School of Journalism and a staff writer at the New Yorker, where he has penned a remarkable series of articles about race, the police and injustice. Whether discussing Black Lives Matter, Ferguson and Baltimore, the legacy of a black presidency—or, more generally, the history of civil rights, violence, incarceration, housing and inequality—Cobb speaks with passion and authority.
