



University of Dayton School of Law *Graduation 2015* Frequently Asked Questions

A Mandatory Graduation Exercise Review will be held on **Wednesday, April 15 at 12:30** in the Courtroom. It will be your chance to review final walking and seating arrangement for the graduation ceremony. If you cannot attend, please email Nan Holler-Potter.

When and where will the Baccalaureate Mass be held?

The service will be held on **Friday, May 1, 2015 at 5:00 pm** in the basement of Chaminade Hall.

When will the commencement ceremonies take place?

The commencement ceremonies will take place on Saturday, May 2, 2015 at 9:00 a.m. at the University of Dayton Arena.

Do my friends and family need tickets for the commencement?

No. There are plenty of seats available in the arena.

How may I obtain announcements?

You may purchase the official Dayton Law announcements from Jostens. Sample announcements are on display at the School of Law on the second floor across from the student mailboxes, at which time you will be provided with information on how to place an order. You may also print your own announcements or purchase them elsewhere.

How will I obtain regalia?

You will order the regalia through Jostens. Follow this link to the website: <http://www.jostens.com/apps/catalog/college/customer/1100060/University-of-Dayton-School-of-Law/>. The website will be active until **January 25, 2015**. Regalia ordered through Jostens will be shipped to the School of Law and will be available for pick-up in the CSO's Office in April. The regalia are yours to keep.

When will I get my honors and/or pro bono cord?

Cords will be distributed with your regalia. Pro bono cords awarded after gown pickup can be picked up from Nan in the Dean of Student's office. Maureen Anderson must confirm the hours before a cord can be issued. **Do not forget to bring your cord with you to the ceremony!**

Can I wear extra cords, pins or items during the ceremony?

Caps and gowns may not be altered in any way. Academic regalia that may be worn at graduation include caps, gowns, and only those honor cords, pro bono cords or LLM/MSL sashes that are distributed by the Dean of Students representative, Nan Holler-Potter.

Remember: Final honors will not be announced during the graduation ceremonies. However, an announcement of tentative honors based on your cumulative grade point average at the end of the Fall 2012 Semester will be mentioned if you have achieved a cumulative grade point average which places you in the top 12% of the class. Tentative honors are announced for ceremonial purposes only and must not be included in resumes, or otherwise treated as official. Final honors will be announced and posted on the website by mid-June. The appropriate notation will be on your diploma. Final honors will be awarded as follows:

Top 2% Summa Cum Laude
Next 3% Magna Cum Laude
Next 7% Cum Laude

When must graduates be at the Arena?

Graduates are expected to be at the Arena and in line **no later than 8:15 a.m!!!**

Where should I park?

Graduates, their families, and friends should park in Arena Parking Lot B, adjacent to the building.

Is handicapped parking available?

Yes. There are many slots adjacent to the Arena.

Is handicapped seating available?

Yes. There are seating spaces available in each section of the arena.

The arena staff will be available to assist with special seating requests as well.

Where do I go when I arrive at the Arena?

Graduates should gather under the East Stands in the concession area. (Do not worry! Someone will be there to guide you!) Please leave your valuables (purses, cameras, etc.) with a friend or family member.

Family members and friends are not permitted in the lineup area. Staff members are actively in the process of lineup, and space is very limited. There will be time for pictures at the reception.

When you arrive in the concession area, look for your name on a sheet of paper hanging on the wall. There will be row lists taped to walls. You should stand near your name. The person whose name is at the top of the list should line up farthest from the wall. The person whose name is at the bottom of the list should line up next to the wall. **PLEASE** listen to staff members as they help you form the line.

What should I wear under my gown?

Something light! The Arena is NOT air conditioned.

On what side do I place my tassel?

Place it on the **right side**. Dean McGreal will announce when everyone should switch it to the left side.

How long will the ceremony last?

Normally, the ceremony lasts about 90 minutes.

After the ceremony, will there be time to take photographs?

NO. Due to the Arena hosting another Commencement immediately following ours, we ask that you depart from the Arena **as soon as possible**. The regalia are yours to keep, so photographs can also be taken at the reception at Keller Hall. The Courtroom will be open to anyone who wishes to have a photograph taken there.

May I bring guests to the reception?

Yes, we want your parents and friends to have the opportunity to meet Dayton Law faculty, staff, students, and new grads!

Where can we park for the reception?

You and your guests may park in any **single letter lot** near the school (**A, B, P, or S1**).

When will I receive my diploma?

You will **not** receive your diploma during the commencement ceremony.
