<p><b>THE BASICS</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>➤ 90 Credits required for graduation</li><li>➤ 12-18 Credits per semester</li><li>➤ Summer credits available with 9 credit limit in 1<sup>st</sup> ½</li></ul>	<p><b>KEY DATES</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>➤ <b>March 24</b> – Summer online registration open</li><li>➤ <b>May 5 – June 23</b> – Summer term</li><li>➤ <b>March 26, 8:00 am</b> – Online registration begins for students graduating in 2015</li></ul>
<p><b>REQUIREMENTS</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>➤ Evidence (offered Fall and Spring)</li><li>➤ ADR (Choose from ADR for the Litigator OR Conflict Management or Interviewing, Counseling &amp; Negotiation [all offered Fall and Spring] (probably already completed). <u>Please note</u>: You can take either ADR for the Litigator OR Conflict Management, but not both. You may take a second ADR course as an elective.</li><li>➤ Required coursework for rising 3L's: Professional Responsibility; Externship/Clinic; and Capstone</li></ul>	
<p><b>FILLING OUT THE SCHEDULE: ELECTIVES</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>➤ Courses covering subject areas tested on the bar [see handout]</li><li>➤ Prerequisites (e.g., Intellectual Property, Evidence, Business Organization, Income Tax) for courses you may want to take later- especially check Capstone course descriptions</li><li>➤ Courses that interest you. Where do you see yourself going?</li><li>➤ Review what courses are tentatively offered for the Spring term [see website]</li></ul>	
<p><b>PLANING AHEAD</b></p> <p>Think about how you want to allocate your remaining credits needed for graduation among the remaining semesters.</p> <p><u>Please note</u>: <i>Beginning the fourth semester, and thereafter, students must maintain at least a cumulative GPA of 2.20, or face academic dismissal. Also, students graduating in December and planning to take the February bar have almost one month less to study for the bar than students graduating in May and taking the July bar.</i></p>
