

LAW 6222-01: Electronic Discovery

This course will serve as an introduction to how the federal rules, case law and best practices in D-Discovery provide the necessary framework for attorneys in this area of litigation. The course will cover all stages of E-Discovery from the preservation of electronic information through production related issues. It will emphasize how proper planning and execution of a discovery plan will take into consideration costs, spoliation, privilege and ethical issues related to electronically stored information.

LAW 6408-01: Legal Innovations Lab

In this skills based course, law students will partner with LexisNexis employees to test new products and services. LAW 6544-01: White Collar Crime (Distance Education Course)

This course examines issues of criminality in the white collar and corporate contexts. Focusing primarily on federal criminal law, it covers selected topics including the definition of white collar crime, entity (corporate) criminal liability, individual liability of corporate officers and employees, and substantive crimes such as the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act, fraud, false statements, perjury, conspiracy, money laundering and RICO. Finally, it will focus on unique aspects of White Collar practice, including numerous practical and legal issues arising from grand jury investigations.
