

PARKING PERMIT FEES TO MOVE TO TIERED STRUCTURE FOR 2019-20

For the 2019-2020 academic year, the University is introducing a four-tiered salary-based structure matching the health benefit tiers to set parking permit fees, with prices ranging from \$255 to \$300.

The new salary pricing structure is as follows:

- Less than \$34,999: \$255
- \$35,000 - \$74,999: \$265
- \$75,000 - \$99,999: \$280
- \$100,000 and above: \$300

The current student fee of \$255 will remain the same as last year, as will the \$220 fee for nighttime parking.

Last year, all daytime employee parking passes were \$255. The fee increases for employees making more than \$35,000 annually will help address continued increases in maintenance and operating costs for UD's 7,500 parking spaces. The fees help fund parking operations and maintenance, which includes renovation, regular repaving, sealing, snow removal and salt application. Based on current projections, we expect the 2019-2020 permit fee rates to remain stable for the next couple of years.

The University's parking fees compare favorably to peer institutions and other local schools, said Darlene Holder, director of parking services. For the 2018-19 academic year, employees at Miami University paid \$125-\$475 for parking, University of Cincinnati employees paid \$576-\$1332, and Wright State University employees paid \$225-\$500.
