WHAT IS UleaD AND WHY SHOULD I ENROLL IN IT?

- UleaD is a 2-credit mini course structured to explore concepts of leadership.
- Based on the Social Change Model of leadership development, the course will help you better understand self and others.
- Leadership is a vital skill within today's society; UleaD provides a comprehensive leadership development opportunity that addresses skills that you will use throughout the rest of your lifetime.

HOW IS THE COURSE "ORGANIZED" AND WHO TEACHES IT?

- The course is facilitated over nine weeks of the fall semester and includes the "Seven C's" of the Social Change Model.
- UleaD course is facilitated by representatives from Greek Life and Leadership, Campus Ministry, Center for Social Concern, Student Life and Kennedy Union, Office of Multicultural Affairs, Community Standards and Civility, Student Development, Housing and Residence Life, Community Wellness, and Leadership Development.

- You will be equipped with the knowledge to further your leadership experience while strengthening your leadership skills.
- You will connect and network with student leaders and administrators from a cross-section of the campus community.
