

Spring Break Housing FAQ

Spring Break 2019

I have paid for the spring semester and spring break is included in this fee. Why do I have to leave housing?

Students are billed for housing on a per semester basis and not a daily rate. The University decided housing would be closed to students during spring break to create a safer environment for our students.

Who is eligible to stay on campus during spring break?

Students that meet one or more of the following criteria will be approved to remain in University housing during spring break:

- Students who have a home/principal residence that is greater than 400 miles from the University's main campus
- Students who are participating in a recognized coop, internship or student teaching experience for which their presence is required during the break
- Students who are working in an on-campus university student employment role with a minimum commitment of 20 hours
- Students who are participating in a recognized in-season athletic team/sport that requires their presence for competitions or supervised training

When is University Housing closed over spring break?

University Housing will be closing on March 8, 2019, at 6pm. Students will not be permitted to remain in their residence beyond this time. Students with flights or pick-up times after 6pm will be directed to the Torch Lounge in Kennedy Union. University housing will reopen on March 17, 2019, at 3pm.

I have heard that the University will be securing all spaces over spring break, what does this mean?

Only a select few University personnel will be able access students residences during spring break. We will grant students access only if necessary.

How was the limit of 400 miles determined?

We determined this based on the number of people the University could support during Spring Break. We used this information during winter break.

I cannot return to my permanent residence or there has been a change in my family circumstances that makes leaving campus difficult. Can I remain in my University Housing?

Each case is reviewed based on their unique circumstances with all departments involved. If you have a similar need and have not previously discussed this with us, please contact us at housing@udayton.edu.

If you feel that you may be eligible to remain on campus because of a unique circumstance at your permanent address, please contact housing@udayton.edu.

I live more than 400 miles away; can I be in my University Housing during part of the week?

If you live more than 400 miles away, you are permitted to remain in University Housing. You can apply for spring break housing in late February. During spring break, you are free to leave and return to the University as you wish during that period. If you will be gone for a specific period during spring break, we ask that you identify that in your application for spring break housing.

If I am eligible to stay in University Housing over spring break, is there an additional charge?

No.

I live in a residence hall. Will I be permitted to remain in my room over break?

No. Students who live in traditional residence halls who meet one or more of the criteria for requesting to stay in University Housing over the break will be assigned a temporary location in a guest house, apartment, or CARE space during the break.
