## IMPORTANT INFORMATION

### JANUARY ORIENTATION PROGRAM

Our new student and transfer orientation program provides you with the opportunity to meet other students who are new to UD. Bring your questions about books, parking, schedules, getting involved on campus and more. The January orientation program will be held on Friday, January 11, 2013, from 9:45 a.m. to 3:15 p.m. in Kennedy Union. The program includes a lunch, welcome from staff and students, breakout sessions for you and your family, and a campus resource fair. ### MOVE-IN

If you'll be living on campus, you may move in after noon on Thursday, January 10, 2013. Founders Hall, Marianist Hall, Marycrest Complex and Stuart Complex will have their main desk staffed 24 hours from this time forward. If you are living in any other University-owned housing, you will need to pick up your key by 4:30 p.m. at the College Park Center. Please bring a photo ID when checking in to your residence.

### ACADEMIC ADVISING

You're not alone in planning your academic experience. You will receive information through Porches ([porches.udayton.edu](http://porches.udayton.edu)) that details how to register for spring classes and provides the contact information for your academic adviser. Throughout your academic career, your adviser will work with you to make sure you're taking the correct classes and fulfilling the requirements for graduation. As a new student, your academic adviser will also help you with any transfer credits you may have. Contact the department of your major if you have any questions.

### CLASS SCHEDULE

### BANKING SERVICES

You won't have to travel far to take care of your banking needs; there are numerous banks in the Dayton area offering checking and savings accounts. Students are welcome to join the Day Air Credit Union, located on campus in Marianist Hall next to the UD post office. Day Air Credit Union ATMs are available in Kennedy Union, V. W. Kettering Residence Hall, Marycrest Complex, Campus South, Marianist Hall, RecPlex and College Park Center. A Fifth Third Bank ATM, PNC ATM and a Chase ATM are also located in Kennedy Union.

## BOOKSTORE

The UD Bookstore offers textbooks, UD gear and more, and it is open Monday to Thursday, 8 a.m. to 7 p.m.; Friday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; and Saturday, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. To order books online, visit [bookstore.udayton.edu](http://bookstore.udayton.edu). For your convenience, orders can be placed for in-store pickup at one of five campus locations. The last day to return textbooks for a full refund — with a receipt — is one week from the start of classes. Please visit the store for refund dates and details.

## FLYERCARD

The FlyerCard combines the student identification card, meal tickets, library card, RecPlex admittance and door access into one. Additionally, students may open a Flyer Express account to use their FlyerCard at 40 locations on and off campus, including the UD Bookstore and all student dining facilities. After registering for classes, you can receive your FlyerCard. Photographs for the FlyerCard are taken in the Campus Card Services office in the Powerhouse, room 102. You may also email your picture to [flyercard@udayton.edu](mailto:flyercard@udayton.edu). Your FlyerCard is important, as it is required for most official University business. ## ON-CAMPUS DINING INFORMATION

From late-night cravings to the comfort of a home-cooked meal, UD Dining Services offers a wide variety of tastes and locations. We have two full-service food courts: Kennedy Union and Marycrest Dining, three-time winner of the Horton Award. We also offer the Emporium, a mini-convenience store with a full-service deli located in Marianist Hall. The Emporium was recently awarded a C-Store “Best in the Business” award by The National Association of College & University Food Services and PepsiCo Foodservice. Virginia Kettering Residence Hall boasts two new restaurants — Passports, offering flavors with a worldly flair, and The Grainary, featuring sandwiches and salads made with Boar’s Head meats and cheeses and a large variety of homemade soups. V. W. Kettering Residence Hall was recently recognized as an “Outstanding Design” in *American School & University* publication. For a quick snack, students can visit the Galley, located inside the Hangar. The Galley offers specialty coffee, freshly baked soft pretzels, ice cream sundaes and milkshakes. Stuart’s Landing, a mini-convenience store located in Stuart Complex, is another option. To replenish after a workout, visit the Chill, a smoothie bar inside the RecPlex. Students living in Marycrest Complex, Marianist Hall, Founders Hall, V.W. Kettering Residence Hall and Stuart Complex are required to purchase a meal plan. ## PARKING PERMITS

All students who require parking on campus must purchase a parking permit. You will need to apply for your permit at [parking.udayton.edu](http://parking.udayton.edu). Residential students will be sold permits for the spring semester on a first-come, first-served basis until all permits are sold. The cost of purchasing a permit starting January 2, 2013, is prorated to \$85 and \$67.50 for evening permits. Annual permits are valid until August 15, 2013.
