Sample Syllabus Statement 1

I will be using the Student Success Network, an early identification and intervention system designed to enable academic success, student persistence and retention, and graduation. When behaviors are observed that suggest a student may be experiencing difficulties that may impede academic success, the instructor/administrator may raise an alert or referral flag that may 1) notify the student of the concern, 2) requests an individual contact the instructor to discuss the issue, and 3) in some instances, also refers the student to another campus resource – such as the Office of Learning Resources, or your Academic Advisor. If you receive an email notification of a concern or referral in any of your courses, it is your responsibility to contact the instructor/administrator as soon as possible to discuss the issue. The purpose of the contact/discussion is to determine the severity of the issue, accurately assess its potential impact on your academic success, and to plan and put into action steps to prevent negative consequences and enable academic success. Sample Syllabus Statement 2

The University of Dayton makes student success a priority. For this reason, I will be using the Student Success Network (SSN) in this course as an early identification and intervention system designed to enable students' academic success and graduation. If I notice that you are struggling with issues such as attendance, class participation, or assignment/test performance, I may choose to send notification through SSN in order to put you in touch with appropriate campus resources. These referrals are designed to maximize your chances for success at the University, not as punishment, so please respond to any communications you may receive from me, your Academic Advisor, your Dean's Office, or other campus offices regarding your academic progress in this course. .
