


## How to Submit an Assignment in Isidore



**Instructions**

Imagine you were the technology coordinator in any of these situations where a student was being bullied online using your classroom's technology (computers, discussion forums, blogs, wikis, instant messaging etc.). You learned of the bullying and feel as something could have been done to prevent it. The superintendent approaches you to do some research and put together resources to inform the school community at the next School Board meeting. She wants the resources to be presented in a professional response paper. The response paper should include the following components:

- *The legal implications of online bullying*—Provide a summary of legal implications that the district should be aware of and provide a list of resources that can be posted on the school's web site.
- *Examples* – Provide a list of resources that illustrate different examples of online bullying and how other schools or businesses, like the Facebook example, have dealt with these issues.
- *Action items* – Provide a list of action items you believe are the most important to address in your district in regards to online bullying.
- *Position Statement* –Write a position statement that describes recommendations for anyone in your district to help combat online bullying. (no more than 200 words)
