### **Your four-year scholarship and grant aid is worth \$102,850.**

**The average UD graduate leaves with less than \$18,000 in student loans**, which is below the national average for all four-year private institutions.

**Eighty-four percent of UD students** begin to repay their student loans within three years of leaving school, compared to 47% nationally.

**Ninety-six percent of UD students** are employed or enrolled in graduate school within six months of graduation.
